1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place? If this is a progress report, what remains to be done?

The promotion of children's rights, peace education and feeding project implemented three major projects which are as follows;

<u>Jam For The Rights of Children Project</u>

<u>December 5, 2010, 7:00 PM, Victory Central Mall Theater</u>

<u>Monumento, Caloocan City, Philippines</u>

Jam for the Rights of Children Project is an advocacy-fundraising concert and cultural event that promoted awareness on children's rights and promotion of peace towards creating child friendly communities. The event was organized to encourage people's participation in raising funds for education, feeding projects, and healthcare programs benefitting indigent children and youth in the various urban poor communities of the cities of Caloocan, Malabon, Navotas, and Valenzuela.

Proceeds of the concert ticket sales which amounted to Php. 400,000.00 was shared by the various participating organizations (Rotary Club of Malabon Highlands, Rotary Club of Malabon East, Gintong Pakpak Foundation, ABSNET CAMANAVA member organizations, and AKCDF) and was used in the various community-based service projects for poor children and youth by the said organizations.

The 2,000 people who attended the concert contributed Php 100.00 each to enjoy the music event and had the opportunity to increase their understanding of children's rights. The people's participation in the concert enabled them to become partners in the advocacy for the amount they paid for the tickets was used in funding various programs and projects securing the rights of children and youth to proper education, care, and development.

The participation of Rotary Club of Sakai Seiryo as one of the project sponsors of Jam for the Rights of Children project together with Rotary Club of Malabon Highlands, Rotary Club of Malabon East, together with Gintong Pakpak Foundation, ABSNET CAMANAVA member organizations and AKCDF was a great opportunity for increasing the Rotary public image as an organization that builds communities, bridges continents for the advancement of children's rights and peace. Thirty Thousands Pesos (Php. 30,000.00) of Rotary Club of Sakai Seiryo's WCS funds was used for these project. However, the said WCS funds invested in the Jam for the Rights of Children project reverted and was used in the Rotary Club of Malabon Highlands service projects which includes the Journey with the Child International Peace Forum on Children's Rights and the Four Months Education and Feeding Assistance for the 75 indigent Children of Jacinto Community Center in Marulas, Valenzuela City, Philippines.

The Rotary-MAPALAD KA, Journey with the Child for Peace International Forum on Children's Rights aimed to strengthen the citizen's solidarity cooperation of various childcare workers, teachers, community leaders, NGO's, children's rights advocates and government agencies to come up with an annual plan on securing the rights of children by actively campaigning for the continued passage of MAPALAD KA's people initiated resolution known as "Mapayapang Komunidad ng Mga Bata" (Communities of Peace for the Children Resolution in the English Language) in various localities nationally and worldwide. This is to encourage continuing citizens participation in the planning and implementation of government programs promoting the rights and welfare of children and youth.

Rotary Club of Malabon Highlands through its WCS Funds from Rotary Club of Sakai Seiryo contributed (Php 60,000.00) for the partial sponsorship of 60 forum participants composed of teachers, childcare workers and community leaders who have committed to introduce the continuing advocacy to protect children's rights and promotion of peace in their schools and communities.

This project realized Rotary's continuing thrust on childcare, peace and conflict resolution for the project came up with a resolution that focused on the following;

- Holding of a continuing annual forum on Children's Rights in the month of October in various schools and barangays in cooperation with Rotary, MAPALAD KA, DSWD, NGO's, Schools and People's organizations in CAMANAVA.
- 2. To engaged in the continuing campaign for the declaration of the people initiated Mapayapang Komunidad ng mga Bata resolution led by Rotary and MAPALAD KA in various Barangays and localities towards building peaceful and child friendly communities that can be replicated worldwide.
- 3. To organize the Jam for the Rights of Children Concert every December of each year for the continuing advocacy of raising people's awareness on children's rights and and citizen's participation in raising funds for developmental programs benefitting indigent children and youth in need of education, nutrition, and healthcare assistance.
- 4. To make the Journey with the Child for Peace International Forum and Camp as a yearly activity in the month of January to advance the citizens solidarity movement for children's rights and peace locally and worldwide in cooperation with Rotary, MAPALAD KA, NGO's, Citizen's Organizations, and Government Agencies.
- To advance the cooperation of Philippine children's rights organizations with Japanese Children's Rights organizations and other groups worldwide concerned with the building of a peaceful world for children.

RCMH Every Child is My Child Education and Feeding Assistance Project for Four months (December 2010- April 2011) for 75 children at Jacinto Community Center in Marulas, Valenzuela City, Philippines

Every Child is my Child Education and Feeding Assistance Project is sponsored by Rotary Club of Sakai Seiryo's WCS funds in the amount of Sixty Thousand Pesos (Php 60,000.00)

It is an on-going project that focuses on children's education and hunger reduction in cooperation with Jacinto Community Center. Jacinto Community Center was established by a protestant pastor to help provide 75 urban poor children educational and feeding assistance. The center is being operated with volunteer church workers.

Rotary Club of Malabon Highlands for its part holds a monthly monitoring of the children in the institution by conducting monthly weighing to know the impact of the project to the community children beneficiaries of the project

Rotary Club of Malabon Highlands members formed a project committee headed by the Service Project Director and made a consultation meeting with the community leaders of Marulas, Jacinto Community in Valenzuela City. Rotarians took charge of the project management of the Education and Feeding Assistance Project in cooperation with church volunteers. They also did a monthly weighing of children together with their volunteer Rotarian health worker. In the organizing of the International Peace Forum on Children's Rights and Jam for the Rights of Children, Rotarians coordinated the contacting of resource persons and artists and assisted as facilitators during the project implementation.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

AKCDF (Abakadang Kayumanggi Community Development Foundation) through its registered social worker assisted Rotary by volunteering their technical assistance in the needs assessment and regular monitoring of the community project.
